The 'HBB' stands for Hugh B. Brown and 'mld' stands for Mary Lou Dixon, which was my maiden name. The final draft was reviewed and then Hugh B. Brown signed the copy that was sent to the recipient.
- 8. The quotation that appears at the bottom of the last page of the November 8th letter was not part of the content of the letter that was sent to the original recipient. It was a quote that I liked from another letter that he had dictated to me. I wanted to remember his exact quote, so I included it at the end of the November 8th letter.
- 9. The handwriting on the first page is my own. It says, "Lost Faith in God, Immortality and ready to chuck it all."
